
Our needs this month are men's large and XL shirts, winter coats, mittens, gloves, and scrubbies.

Some may wonder where our library books come from. The answer: our members, new and used bookstores, and online orders from Christianbook.com. But no matter how I get a book, I must depend on the online books' synopsis or flip through a book that I have in hand. So, it's great when someone gives me a review of a book they've read. John Gillen recently reviewed "Choose Greatness: 11 Wise Decisions That Brave Young Men Make," by Gary Chapman and Clarence Shuler. John was very thorough in his review, but for the sake of space in the newsletter, here are highlights from his review regarding each chapter in the book, in John's words:

*one of the most important books a young man can read in his journey early on.

*target group is young teens, 12 to 13 years.

*stay in school and enjoy what you are studying.

*IAD (Internet Attention Disorder). Why young teens spend so much time on technology and the issues that come from that.

*special studying techniques and defines what a good job is.

*relationships, peer pressure and decision making; our past reflects our future, and you need to know yourself before you help others.

*sexual responsibilities and how we are designed in God's image.

*drugs and alcohol use.

*how and why to build diverse friendships.

*finding the truth about God, finding what you believe as an individual, not just what your parents believed.

*the conclusion has the reader evaluate everything they learned and asks a ton of questions (which John really enjoyed).

John also found a noteworthy quote: "Return good for evil and change the world." Thank you, John, for such a thorough review! The book is back on the shelf to inspire another young man in his walk-through life. Check it out!
